## **GUEST SPEAKERS**

### **Fr. Thomas Schaeffgen, O.P.**



Fr. Thomas is from Memphis, TN from a family of four. Growing up, he loved golf, baseball, swimming, building Lego cities, and playing in the dirt (no, seriously). Before becoming a Dominican Friar, he studied architecture at Tulane University and then went to work in a firm in Denver. There were a variety of people who told him he would be a good priest, but probably the most awkward experience was when a girl he had a crush on told

him that he should be a priest. Fr. Thomas joined the Dominicans because he was drawn to the Dominican ideal of study and community and wanted to pursue the intellectual life. When he has time, he likes road trips, walking, biking, reading, crossword puzzles, and sleeping.

### **Joe Falter**



Joe studied Journalism and Mass Communications at Kansas State University. He would become a Catalyst Instructor at Kansas State, covering topics like personal growth, including self-confidence, goal-setting, motivation, and relationships. Joe went on to being New Chapter Development Coordinator for Delta Sigma Phi Fraternity in Indianapolis. He worked with a team of professionals to establish new chapters at universities across the country, by recruiting men who value culture, harmony, friendship, diversity, chivalry, and the pursuit of excellence. “Simply put, I connect college students with their peers who have a common goal - to better themselves.” Finally, Joe is now Youth Market Director at American Heart Association in Kansas City.
